Volunteering Opportunities

ASPIRE WORKSHOP CO-FACILITATOR

*January–November**

Support students in exploring their career interests and future pathways through interactive workshops.

Audience: Upper secondary school students

Duration: 1 hour

Mode: Online or face-to-face (*selected schools across Malaysia*)

Your role:

- Share your career journey
- Engage students in discussions
- Encourage reflection on aspirations

ACE CAMP MENTOR

10–12 February 2026

Mentor a small group of students and set goals for their future in a 3-day camp

Audience: Post-SPM students (*awaiting results*)

Duration: 1 hour slots per day

Mode: Face-to-face (Kuala Lumpur) and online check-ins

Your role:

- Mentor a small group of students
- Facilitate discussions and activities
- Support students in setting goals

CICF EXHIBITOR

*May–October 2026**

Engage with students at career fairs by sharing insights into the financial industry.

Audience: Upper secondary school students

Duration: 4–6 hours

Mode: Face-to-face (*selected schools across Malaysia*)

Your role:

- Share industry insights
- Answer students' questions
- Inspire exploration of career possibilities

English Proficiency

English Proficiency focuses on **strengthening students' confidence and ability to communicate in English**. It provides practical exposure, guided practice, and interactive learning experiences to help students build essential language skills for their education and future careers.

Volunteering Opportunities

The following opportunities fall under **HIP-FINCO Reads**, a programme which aims to improve English proficiency. These activities focus on developing early literacy and critical thinking among primary school students.

STORY TELLER

*April–November 2026**

Audience: 10–12 year old students
Group size: 15–40 students per session
Duration: 1.5 hours
Mode: Face-to-face

Your role:

- Read a selected story and facilitate reading activities with the students
- Interact with the students to test their understanding

SUITABLE FOR CEO

READING BUDDY

*July–November 2026**

Audience: 7 year old students
Group size: Individual
Duration: 1 hour
Mode: Face-to-face

Your role:

- Listen and guide students to read a passage aloud (one-to-one)
- Encourage and support students in building confidence

JUDGE: OUTSTANDING STUDENT COMPETITION

1–3 September 2026

CEO will attend an online session with two other judges, to judge 5 finalists' presentations on the selected theme.

Audience: Primary *and* secondary students
Duration: 1 hour
Mode: Online

Your role:

- Deliberate student submissions alongside two other judges to select the winners

Financial Literacy: Good SENS

Social Enterprise Network for Schools (Good SENS) is FINCO’s flagship financial literacy program **implemented over 6 months** to provide opportunities for Year 4 to Year 6 students to apply financial literacy concepts in real-life situations, while simultaneously helping them form healthy financial habits in the long term.

Group size: 50–100 students per session

Format: Face-to-face or online (*selected schools across Malaysia*)

*Year-long**

Sharing session with secondary school students, covering **personal financial management and practical tips** to encourage thoughtful money decisions early in life.

Audience: Upper secondary school students

Duration: 30 minutes

Group size: 60–100 students per session

Disaster Relief & Flood Preparedness

Disaster Relief **supports national schools and education institutions affected by emergencies and natural disasters** by coordinating efforts to support schools and students affected by disasters by providing timely assistance with preparedness, clean-up and repairs.

Volunteering Opportunities

Disaster Relief

*Year-long**

Mitigate the impact of disasters so that students can remain focused on their education.

Your role:

- Provide financial or in-kind aid to schools based on their specific needs
- Participate in on-the-ground clean-up efforts to help schools resume operations quickly (based on the request from schools)

Flood Preparedness

*Year-long**

Strengthen school preparedness for floods to safeguard learning environments and minimise educational disruption.

Your role:

- Support the delivery of disaster preparedness storytelling sessions to primary school students
- Provide financial support towards preparedness grants for national schools based on their specific needs

Shared & Consultancy Programmes

Through its Shared and Consultancy Programmes, FINCO partners with its members to both **scale existing education initiatives** and **design customised solutions that benefit schools, students, and teachers.**

Other Collaboration Opportunities

Shared Programmes

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

Who can volunteer?

Volunteering is open to individuals from organisations that are registered members of FINCO.

Do I require volunteering experience?

No prior volunteering experience is required. However, you are required to attend a FINCO briefing before the event. You will be briefed on your specific task and other important things to note.

What do I do if i'm interested in volunteering?

You may complete the volunteer registration form and indicate the programme you are interested in. FINCO will get in touch to confirm the volunteering session and arrange a date for the briefing.

Is there anything I need to prepare before the session?

Yes. The FINCO team will brief you prior to the session, and you will be required to sign a **Child Protection Declaration form**. After the session, you will need to complete a post-volunteer survey and provide feedback on the session.

Wil FINCO cover travel costs?

No. Any travel or accommodation costs will be borne by you or your organisation. Please check with your organisation before volunteering.



Where will the volunteering sessions take place?

This depends on what you are volunteering for. Please read the description of the volunteering opportunity you are interested in to know more!

What if I am not able to make it to the volunteering session?

Kindly inform the FINCO team **at least 2–3 weeks before the event**. This will allow sufficient time to arrange for a replacement volunteer. If possible, please suggest another volunteer to take your place.

What language will the session be conducted in?

FINCO encourages the use of **English** throughout the sessions. However, due to the low English proficiency with some of the students, you may use Bahasa Malaysia to translate or answer certain questions.

Will FINCO provide a health and safety briefing for disaster relief volunteering?

Yes. FINCO will provide a briefing and conduct a risk assessment to ensure your safety. Personal accident insurance will also be provided.

Can I post my volunteering experience on social media?

Yes, of course! However, when sharing photos from volunteering sessions, please ensure that the faces of students under 18 years old are blurred or properly censored before posting, in line with MOE guidelines.

Will FINCO provide a volunteering report for my organisation?

Yes, this can be provided upon request by your organisation.
